🔥 **Where:** Alpine Camp in Mentone, AL

🔥 **Cost:** \$125 per person

🔥 **What is Family Camp?**

Family Camp is a weekend away for our church family (**every age and stage**). Our hope is that Family Camp will be a taste of heaven – a fun, restful, and joy-filled experience.

🔥 **Where is Family Camp?**

We will spend the weekend on Lookout Mountain at Alpine Camp in Mentone, AL. We will sleep in open-air cabins (windows have screens), and we will eat, play, and worship together as a church family.

🔥 **When can I register?**

Registration opens on July 17.

Registration closes on Friday, September 5.
Space is limited, so don't wait to sign up!

🔥 **What is included in the price?**

The registration fee includes 5 meals, all activities, and a t-shirt.

🔥 **Are there scholarships available?**

Yes. We do not want the cost to keep you or your family from attending! Before you register, please email Adam "Bully" Shields at ashields@faith-pca.org.

🔥 **What is the Family Camp Schedule?**

Friday will consist of check-in, dinner, team games, and s'mores.
Saturday will be a busy day full of camp activities and fellowship.
On Sunday, we will worship together and dismiss before lunch.
We will send out a more detailed schedule the week of Family Camp.

🔥 **What are the sleeping arrangements?**

We will have all-female and all-male cabins. For families, girls will stay with their mother, and boys will stay with their father. The number of beds varies per cabin; it is likely that you will share a cabin with another family. You are welcome to request roommates on your registration form. If you have any questions about sleeping arrangements, please contact Adam "Bully" Shields at ashields@faith-pca.org.

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Are bathrooms in the cabins?

No; there will be separate bathhouses for men and women.

Is there a minimum age for attending Family Camp?

No; this is left to parents' discretion. Please consider that there are minimal outlets in cabins for sound machines, nightlights, monitors, etc. If you have a child that will sleep in a pack-n-play, you will need to bring your own. All children (through high school) must register with an attending parent/guardian.

If I have a food allergy, will Alpine Camp make accommodations?

Yes, please indicate any food allergies or other concerns on your registration form. Alpine has a secondary kitchen used only for food allergy preparation.

Is Alpine accessible for people with mobility concerns?

There is one cabin that is ADA accessible. There are also other cabins and bathhouses with ramps instead of stairs if needed. If you have any questions or concerns, contact Adam "Bully" Shields at ashields@faith-pca.org.

Is there a minimum age for the ropes course?

Yes; the minimum age will vary depending on the ropes course element. More details on activities are coming soon.

Can I watch a college football game?

What should I bring?

We will send a more detailed packing list later. However, some items you will need are sheets, towels, and shower shoes.
