New City Catechism

Reading of the Scripture

Romans 2:1-16

¹Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For
in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge,
practice the very same things. ²We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on
those who practice such things. ³Do you suppose, O man—you who judge those who
practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment
of God? ⁴Or do you presume on the riches of His kindness and forbearance and
patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance? ⁵But
because of your hard and impenitent heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on
the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.

⁶He will render to each one according to his works: ⁷to those who by patience
in well-doing seek for glory and honor and immortality, He will give eternal life; ⁸but
for those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness,
there will be wrath and fury. ⁹There will be tribulation and distress for every human
being who does evil, the Jew first and also the Greek, ¹⁰but glory and honor and
peace for everyone who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek. ¹¹For God
shows no partiality.

¹²For all who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law,
and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. ¹³For it is not the
hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will
be justified. ¹⁴For when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do what the law
requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law. ¹⁵They
show that the work of the law is written on their hearts, while their conscience also
bears witness, and their conflicting thoughts accuse or even excuse them ¹⁶on that
day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus.

Partaking of the Lord's Supper at Faith

If you know and love the Lord Jesus Christ, are earnestly repentant of your
sins, are willing to renew your commitment to Christ, and are a member in good
standing with a branch of Christ's church that preaches Jesus Christ as the only way
to God the Father, we welcome you to partake of this sacrament with us. An usher
will dismiss rows starting at the front of each section.

Please come forward using the center aisle, and wait until an usher directs
you to one of the stations. We encourage families to come together. Please take a
piece of bread and a cup as the trays of elements are passed. Cups with wine and
cups with juice are marked on the trays. You will consume the elements while you
are at the front. Return to your seat by way of the outside aisles. If you cannot come
forward, please ask someone near you to alert a server, and an elder will bring the
elements to you.

Note for Children: Children who have not yet professed their faith in Christ
or been admitted to the Table are encouraged to come forward with their families
for prayer. Children and adults should partake only after professing their faith publicly.
